This is the last Will and Testament of me Elizabeth Jones of the Parish of Walro, in the County of Cambridge and parts of all freehold messuages or tenements or dwellinghouses and premises situate at Starbafild in the County of Cambridge with the Appurtenances thereto belonging unto James or James or James or James in the Parish of Walro aforesaid Gentleman and George Edwards of the same County in the said Parish of Walro I hereby give and assign upon trust after deducting the necessary expenses for repairs and all other outgoings or whatsover to be paid and suffer my brother Edmund Jones to have and take the rents issues and profits during the term of his natural life and from and immediately after his decease upon trust to convey the same unto all and every the Children that he may have at his decease in equal shares and proportions if more than one as tenants in common and not as joint tenants and their several and respective heirs and assigns for ever but if but one child shall live in trust for such one child his heirs and assigns for ever upon trust after deducting the necessary expenses for repairs and all other outgoings whatsover to be paid and suffer my brother Edmund Jones to have and take the rents issues and profits during the term of his natural life and from and immediately after his decease upon trust to convey the same unto all and every the Children that he may have at his decease in equal shares and proportions if more than one as equal tenants and to tenants in common and not as joint tenants and their several and respective heirs and assigns for ever but if but one child shall live in trust for such one child his heirs and assigns for ever I give and bequeath all my funded property in the said County of Cambridge of my just debts and funeral and testamentary expenses to be paid the following legacies vizt to Sarah ^{widow} of Slip in the County of Oxford one hundred pounds to John ^{widow} the son the sum of fifteen pounds of life money to Thomas ^{widow} Parson now residing with the above to George Edwards the sum of fifteen pounds and the residue and remainder of my said son's and funded property together with the residue of all other my real and personal estate I do give and bequeath unto my brother Elizabeth Jones for her own use and benefit and for the use about the said James and George Edwards Executors of this my said will I in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this fifth day of October one thousand eight hundred and twenty one Elizabeth Jones $\overline{\text{E}}$ signed sealed and delivered by the above named Elizabeth Jones as and for her last will and testament in the presence of us who in her presence and in the presence of each have hereunto subscribed our names as witnesses = James Cotton George Edwards = George Osgood =

On the 30th Oct 1821 Adminor with the will annexed of all and singular the goods Chattels and Credits of Elizabeth Jones late of the

parish of Exeter in the County of Devon spiritual benefit was granted to Elizabeth Jones widow the natural and lawful mother and residuary executrix named in the said will bearing date first made by Exeter July 15 Administ^r James Dunn and George Edwards the Executors bearing first witness.

This is the last Will and Testament of my beloved friend of London in the County of Middlesex Mary Agnes wife of all lawful but of sound mind and understanding whereby I do give and bequeath to my dear and my body to be committed to the earth from and after my decease my just debts provided of my private goods and all other property whatsoever I do bequeath as follows that is to say I do give and bequeath to my beloved daughter Sarah one fourth of such produce due yearly to my beloved sister to my beloved sister Samuel Isaac should either out of my sister's estate into the marriage state from and after that period they shall have their moiety which said moiety shall be divided between the said unmarried and at the decease of my beloved mother Sarah then I do give and bequeath to be divided between my three sisters or such of them as may then be unmarried also I do give and bequeath to my dear friend Philip Isaac what shall remain of my said estate after paying my just debts as soon as the proceeds of my estate shall be received and as my said Executor will have small debts to pay the same he shall at all times keep forty pounds in hand to defray the same after having previously paid my just debts due to Creditors and it is further my will that my said Executor shall not make any division between the legatees hereinbefore until such time my just debts are paid In witness whereof to this my last Will I have set my hand and seal this twenty third day of February in the year eight hundred and twenty one Sam^l Isaac Esq^r Philip Isaac Esq^r R^l Esq^r 1/1

Of Leonora Johnson give and bequeath to my dear Cousin Francis John Johnson the daughter of the late Capt^l Robert Johnson and the Widow of Major Johnson of Dorchester all and a very thing that I do possess of including the furniture China plate books a Cloak the large diamond ring that was my dear Mother's the ruby d^r a set with a diamond on each side which was my respected Grandmother's a set of 200 and all her ornaments and ornaments excepting the few which are mentioned also 300 in the year 1800 and 100 in the 5th 1800 and whatever other money after the little legacies are paid either in the bank or elsewhere I give to the eldest daughter of my dear Cousin George Esq^r 2000 pounds to my dear Cousin Philip Esq^r of Curcark 2000 I give the silver snuff box that was my dear father's the date 1662 Chambers Patron of the Bishop of Exeter and the said Philip Esq^r holds for Oysters and the silver tankard to Mr Esq^r his wife a small ruby brooch ring
